## **SPECIAL GRANTS HELP TO MAKE OAKLAND COUNTY A GREAT PLACE TO LIVE, WORK, PLAY & PROSPER**

The Oakland County Board of Commissioners continues to develop sound fiscal policy and seek ways to provide quality county living for all. Our county has been successful in obtaining grants that help in areas of law enforcement, public health, homeland security, community development, and housing.

The Board has supported the following grants received by the County's Community and Home Improvement Division for the Fiscal Year 2004:

- **Comprehensive Housing Counseling Services** - offers free counseling relating to home ownership, rental and mortgage matters, first-time homebuyers and Home Equity Conversion Mortgage Programs. Counseling is free to residents of Oakland County. The Community and Home Improvement Division is located at 1200 North Telegraph Road
- **Housing Rehabilitation Loan** - provides financial assistance for home improvements with 0% to 3% interest loans available up to \$18,000.

## **SOUND FINANCIAL PLANNING PUTS OAKLAND COUNTY AHEAD**

While Oakland County more than meets its current obligation, the General Accounting Standards Board (GASB) has issued a new accounting rule--Statement 43-- regarding financial reporting for retirement benefits. This accounting rule change will take effect in Fiscal Year 2007 and will increase the obligations of governments like Oakland County two years from now. As a measure of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners' sound financial planning, County Commissioners approved funding of \$51 million to make sure that the County's commitment to its retirees is kept two years ahead of schedule.

Anticipating this accounting change, Oakland County will have taken into account this actuarial liability. This action will also earn about \$225 million in additional investment income without increasing County taxes. This action and plan by the Oakland County Board of Commissioners is further evidence of the sound and prudent County government citizens of Oakland County have come to expect and deserve.
