BALANCED 2012-2014 BUDGET GOES TO FULL BOARD FOR VOTE

The Oakland Board of Commissioners' Finance Committee has completed hearings into the 2012-2014 county budget presented by County Executive L. Brooks Patterson in July. General Fund spending will rise to \$412 million in 2012, up from \$410 million in 2011. The revised, recommended budget is balanced for the next three years – the only triennial government budget in the country.

County Commissioners and the County Executive credit advanced, well-designed, in-depth budget planning with adjustments for declining revenues and cooperation of all departments as being instrumental in maintaining the county's AAA bond rating, even as property tax revenues continue to decline.

The county avoided cutting employee salaries and mass layoffs. There are no raises or hiring, and every time someone leaves county employment the position remains vacant. The Oakland County Commission's Finance Committee concluded budget hearings in August, and the whole Board is slated to vote on the Finance Committee's recommendations in September. No tax increases are included. The Board of Commissioners has lowered, but has never raised property taxes since it was created to succeed the County Board of Supervisors almost a half-century ago.



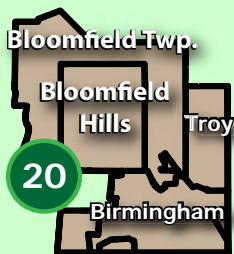

COUNTY UPGRADES FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY

Residents of Oakland County can now access online monthly reports that update how taxpayers' money is being spent. The county has upgraded its financial transparency website to include reports revised every month, instead of once every year as it has been in the past.

The newly improved site allows residents to sign up to be automatically notified by e-mail when new information and new reports become available.

The reports are primarily used by budget managers to help monitor revenues and expenses against their authorized annual budgets. The site includes audited reports that date back as far as fiscal year 2002. Also included are unaudited budgets for departments such as the Board of Commissioners, the Courts, and the Sheriff.
