Also provides supervised independent living (age 16-18), Adventure Challenge Ropes course program for school, and community and corporate groups.

The residential program is designed for at-risk youth whose problems at home, school, or in the community deem placement necessary to bring about change. Youth are engaged in individual and group counseling, family counseling, year-round academic education, pre-vocational training, on-site job placement, therapeutic recreation, and aftercare. Young people are taught how to make good choices and sound decisions. A major program goal is the child's return to family and community as a healthy productive citizen.

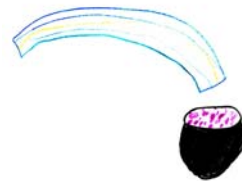
