Information is shared with a volunteer dentist. You will be notified of the dentist's name and phone number. You will be responsible for scheduling an appointment for an examination. Final acceptance in the program will only be made after the dentist examines the applicant and determines the treatment needs. Upon receipt, your application is placed on our waiting list. You will be contacted when your application comes up for review.
