*CLIENT ELIGIBILITY:* Cancer patients.

*SERVICES PROVIDED:* Offers care and programs in virtually every aspect of cancer, from prevention, early detection, and hospice care. The Institute offers 10 multispecialty teams - groups of cancer experts from various disciplines who collectively review cases and determine the best treatment options for patients. A variety of support groups are available to help patients and caregivers cope.

Regional offices provide health education programs on cancer prevention, free of charge to community organizations, schools, and worksites. Speaker programs are available on general cancer information, breast and prostate health, nutrition and diet, and the hazards of tobacco for students in grades K-12.

Health fair exhibits and displays are also available. Low-and-no-cost medical supplies, a food supplement program, ostomy and wound care, and durable medication equipment (DME) are available. Volunteers transport ambulatory patients to cancer-related medical appointments. A telephone reassurance program (TRP) offers comforting phone calls to homebound cancer patients and their caregivers.

The Karmanos Cancer Institute Prevention Center - Berkley provide clinical detection and diagnostic services for breast cancer. The Troy Prevention Center offers risk reduction services such as genetic and nutrition counseling and other cancer screenings on specified education awareness days. The mobile detection center takes screening mammography to churches, worksites, service centers, and community groups throughout southeastern Michigan.

The Cancer Information Service is a toll-free telephone response, which provides up-to-date information on cancer to patients and their families, health professionals, and the public. The CIS office is open Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

*CLIENT FEES:* No charge for regional office medical programs, support groups, or educational programs. Small charge for food supplemental program. Sliding scale for screening, home care, and hospice, if not covered by insurance. Insurance coverage accepted for clinical fee.

*INTAKE PROCEDURES:* Varies – please call.

*VOLUNTEERS:* Office skills, leadership, drivers, health educators, data entry, receptionists, clinical care support, and special projects.
