This award consists of six activities designed to assist Oakland County reduce its energy footprint. Activities include - 1: Building and Facilities Energy Audits - This will assist the County in determining which retrofits will produce the best return on investment (ROI) and provide the greatest reduction in energy use. 2: Facilities Management Energy Program - This will be the implementation of the results of the energy audits. We anticipate projects involving weather stripping, HVAC equipment replacements, lighting retrofits; pump optimizations, and window replacements. 3: Airport Site lighting LED Replacements - replacement of HID street and parking lot light pole heads with new LED fixtures at the Oakland County International Airport (OCIA). 4: New Airport Terminal Building - Renewable Energy Enhancements - This component of the award will place photovoltaic arrays and a wind turbine on the roof of the new terminal building at OCIA. The products selected and installed will showcase the technology and promote local manufactures. 5: New Airport Terminal Building - Energy Saving and Avoidance Construction Enhancements - This activity builds energy saving components such as a Hybrid HVAC system including a geothermal field, extensive building insulation.

Grant received through and to respond to which proposals and on March 29, 2010 selected the firm for additional construction. The first of these audits was conducted on April 13 and 14, 2010. The County entered into negotiations with the selected firm. On May 31, 2010 Oakland County entered into a professional service contract for \$193,615.00 with Fishbeck, Thompson, Carr & Huber of Grand Rapids, Michigan to the perform energy audits in County owned facilities. On June 9, 2010 a kick off meeting was held between County departments involved in the audit and Fishbeck. Fishbeck outlined the information needed from the departments and the County gathered energy and building data during the balance of June. Audit meetings will be scheduled in July.

Neumann Smith Architecture and Peter Basso Associates brought forward their design proposals for the County's review in mid April. Meetings were held in April and May to review design and specification progress. Documents were turned over to the Construction Manager for the Airport project who has been bidding the
