

## When you call for your assessment

- Tell the person you speak with that you have an Oakland County Medicaid card from the FIA office.
- You will be asked for your recipient ID number and the county code, both located on the front of your Medicaid card.
- You will be scheduled an appointment for an assessment.
- You may go into treatment immediately after your assessment appointment or it may take up to several days, depending on your substance abuse needs and the program you will be entering.

## The Assessment

- Your first step to treatment is to make an appointment for an assessment. The assessment may be in person or over the phone.
- Your care manager will talk to you about your choices and about what types of treatment might work best for you.
- Then, depending on your needs, the following treatment services may be approved under your Medicaid insurance plan.

## Types of Service

**I.O.P.** (Intensive Outpatient)

with overnight stay

or

3 hours or more per day,  
multiple days a week.

**O.P.** (Outpatient) scheduled by therapist per individual needs. Can be individual or group.
