**GETTING HELP:**

The Process of finding needed health care services, including treatment for substance abuse, is often very confusing to the consumer. A person may know that he/she or someone he/she cares about needs help, but may not know what kind of help, and where or how to go about getting it. Two areas, financial resources and the type of services needed must be considered. The following chart may be of assistance.

<b>Financial Resources</b>	
If you have:	Do the following:
Medical Ins-EAP at work	Call your EAP (Employee Assistance Program) representative. He/she will help you find the help you need.
Medical Ins.-No EAP	Call your insurance carrier for information, or check the yellow pages under Alcohol & Drug treatment. Often programs list major insurance that they accept.
Private Pay	The Oakland County Health Division/Office of Substance Abuse Services maintains a current listing of all licensed treatment providers in Oakland County. For information or listing call (248)858-0001.
No Insurance, Underinsured and Low Income/No Income	Treatment funding on a sliding fee scale is available through the Oakland County Health Division/Office of Substance Abuse Services. Current ID, Proof of income, residency and current or last employment required. Call PACE (248) 858-5200 for information on programs, funding eligibility, screening and prior authorizations, and referrals.
Medicaid, Adult Benefit Waiver (ABW), and MICHild from Oakland County	Call PACE (248) 858-5200 for approved outpatient programs near you or if you think you are in need of intensive substance abuse treatment services
<b>Type of Service</b>	
Residential-24 hrs/day for 10 days or longer	For person who cannot stay sober without intense structure and support to break the cycle of usage.
IOP (Intensive Outpatient)-3 hours or more/day/multiple days per week	Similar to residential, less intense, very supportive. Excellent choice for persons who need to remain on their jobs, stay in school, or remain at home.
OP (Outpatient)-Individual and Group	Best place to start if you are unsure what kind of help you need. Also excellent support after residential or IOP treatment programs.
Self Help Groups-available in all communities at NO charge	AA [Alcoholics Anonymous] (248) 332-3521 NA [Narcotics Anonymous] (248) 543-7200 Alanon/Alateen [For family or friends of addicted persons] (248) 706-1020
