## Oakland County Health Division Announces Second Dose 2009 H1N1 Clinics for Children

Oakland County Health Division announces second dose 2009 H1N1 clinics for children 6 months through 9 years of age that *received a first dose at an Oakland County Health Division clinic*. This second dose clinic will begin on Monday, November 30, 2009 and will continue until further notice at the following location only:

*Pre-enrollment is required. Walk-ins will not be accepted.*

### **Pre-enrollment in our new system is required for this clinic. Walk-ins will not be allowed.**

Clients can pre-enroll their children for a second 2009 H1N1 vaccination dose at [www.oakgov.com/health](http://www.oakgov.com/health). Pre-enrollment in our new system will allow clients to select the clinic date and time of their choice and also provides a consent form that must be taken to the clinic where they pre-enrolled.

Clients without access to the internet may call 248-858-1200 to pre-enroll over the phone. Their consent form will be delivered to the clinic for the date they pre-enrolled.

"The new pre-enrollment system was developed to reduce lines as only 100 children will be allowed to pre-enroll for each hour the second dose clinic is operating," states Kathy Forzley, Manager/Health Officer, Oakland County Health Division. "It is important that children under 10 years of age receive their second dose in order to maximize their immunity against the 2009 H1N1 flu."

To date, OCHD has vaccinated more than 38,000 people against 2009 H1N1 and pushed out more than 150,000 doses to hospitals and physicians in Oakland County.

H1N1 is limited and there are strict guidelines for those who can receive the shot.

The target population is identified as:

- Pregnant women
- Children and young adults 6 months through 24 years of age
- Caregivers for children under 6 months of age
