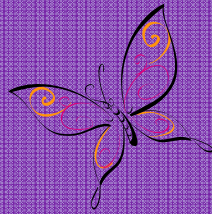

Master Gardeners will receive six full-credit education hours for attending.

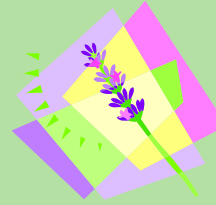
