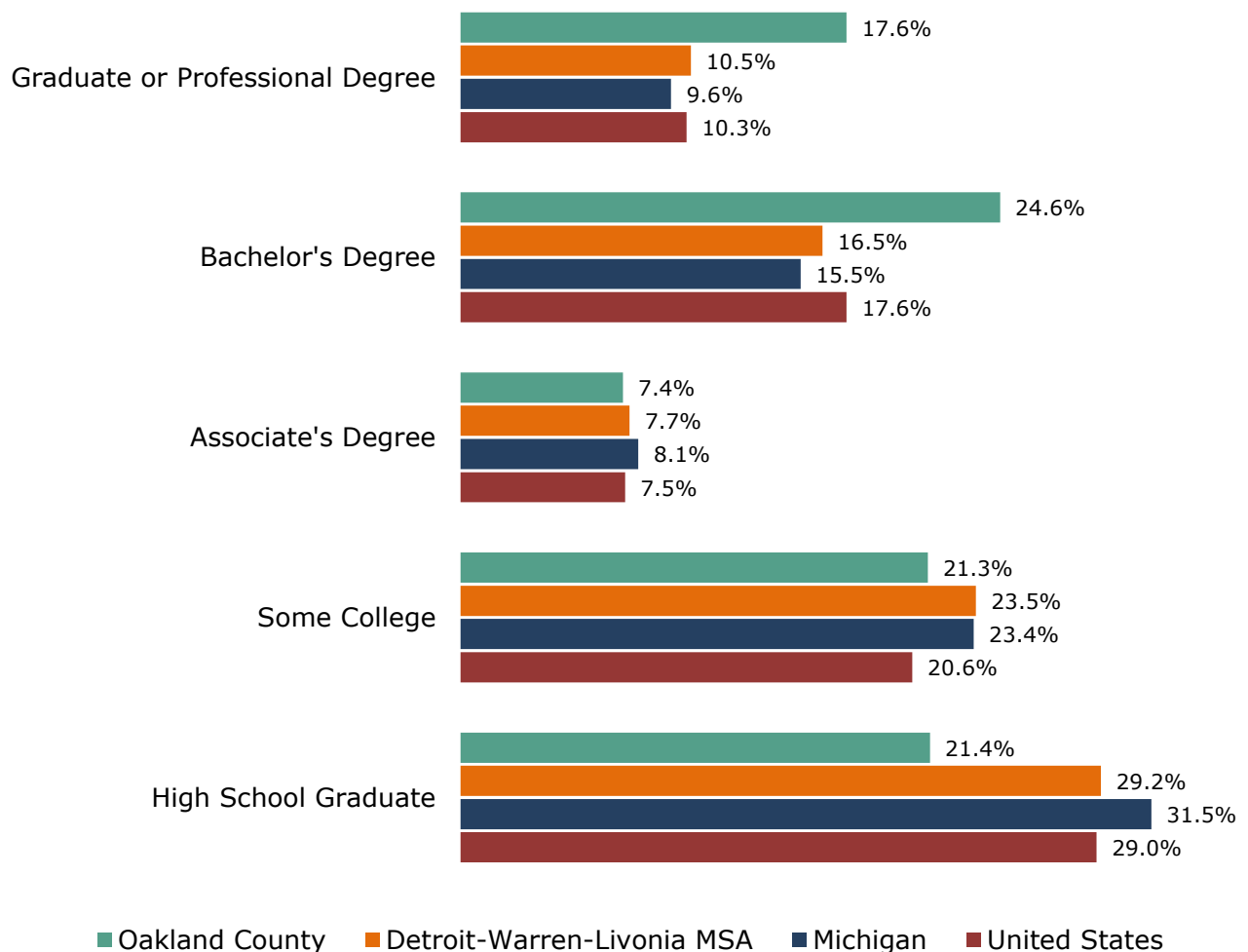


# EDUCATION

## Nation, State, and Local Comparisons

- Oakland County outranks the State of Michigan by over 9% and the nation by 7% in the number of residents age 25 or over who have earned a bachelor's degree
- Oakland County outranks the State of Michigan by 8% and the nation by more than 7% in the number of residents age 25 or over who have earned graduate or professional degrees
- The county is also more highly educated than the Detroit-Warren-Livonia Metropolitan Statistical Area with 8% more bachelor's degrees and 7% more graduate or professional degrees

### Oakland County Residents are More Highly Educated than the State, Nation, and Region

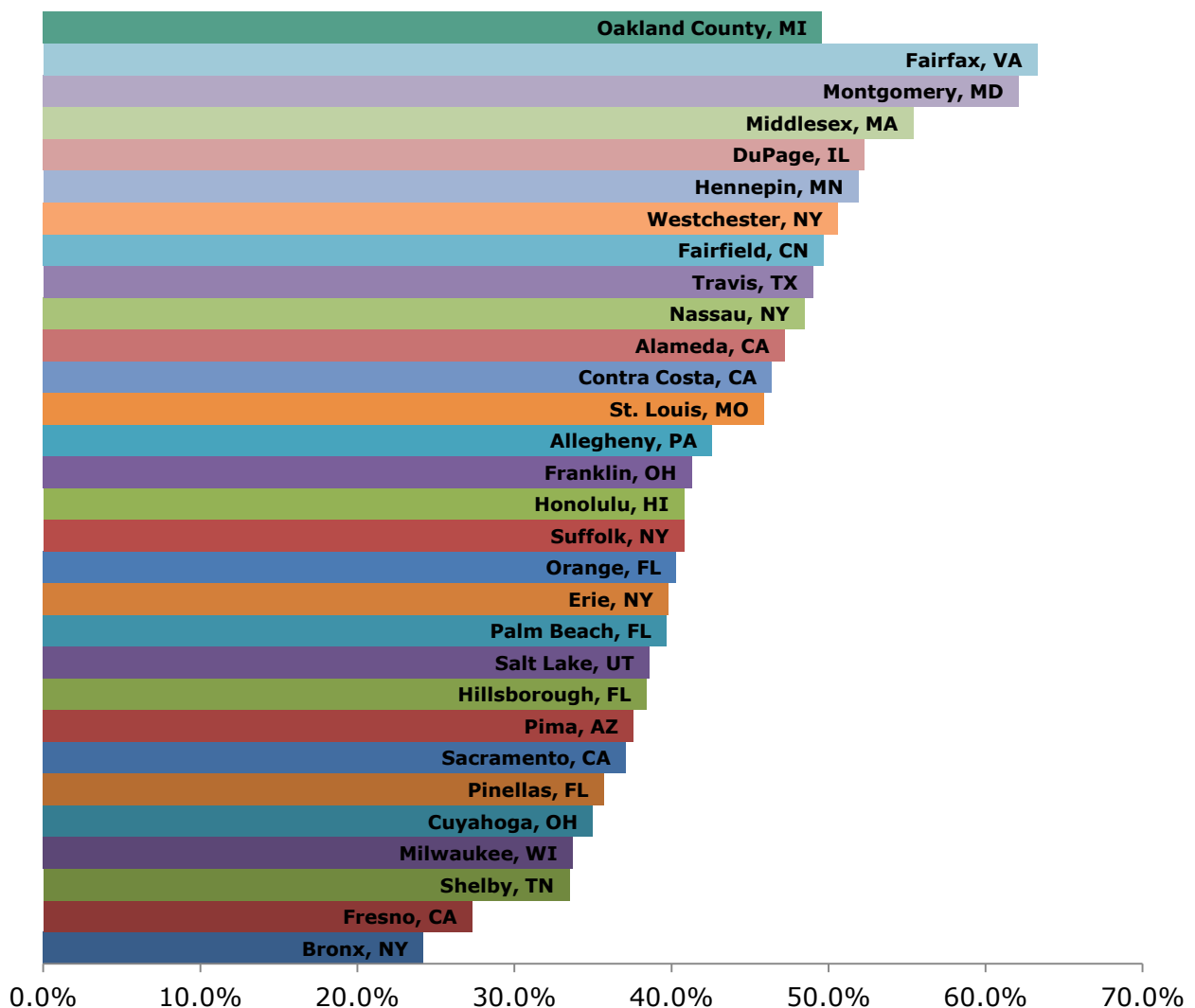

## Nation, State, and Local Comparisons

- Oakland County outranks the State of Michigan by over 9% and the nation by 7% in the number of residents age 25 or over who have earned a bachelor's degree
- According to the University of Michigan, Oakland County ranks 8<sup>th</sup> on indicators of future prosperity, including education levels, poverty rates, income, and the number of managerial and professional positions among all counties nationwide with a population between 900,000 and 1,500,000
- With 49.6% of Oakland County residents age 25 or over holding at least an associate's degree, Oakland County ranks 8<sup>th</sup> nationwide among similarly sized counties
