

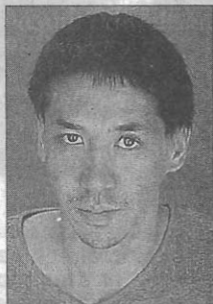

Family dispute leads
to assault charges

BRANDON TWP. — An Ypsilanti man accused of trying to run over his brother-in-law following a family argument over a crying child remains in custody in the Oakland County Jail on a \$100,000 bond.

Oakland County Sheriff's Office Deputies charged James Tuing Huie, 28, with felonious assault Sept. 16 after neighbors said he hit his 35-year-old brother-in-law with his truck.

According to reports, Huie was upset that one of his nephews cried for 20 minutes on a drive back from his grandparents' home. Arriving at his sister's home on the 2700 block of Bennington Street, Huie reportedly got in an argument with his sister and at one point allegedly raised his fist.

At this point, deputies said, Huie's brother-in-law forced him from the home. *Huie's sister reportedly tossed some of his belongings on the lawn during the melee.*

The two men separated and Huie reportedly went to his truck parked across the street. The brother-in-law told

deputies he stepped in front of the truck to return Huie's possessions and Huie struck him, sending him over the hood.

Witnesses told deputies Huie left, but came back a short time later and threatened to kill the couple and burn down their home.

Deputies said the found Huie at his mother's home on the 2700 block of Bennington Street. After taking Huie into custody, they reported finding a half-smoked marijuana "blunt" and a bottle containing a variety of pills.
