

# Program Accepts Unused Prescriptions

Cops in Oakland County offer residents a safe solution for getting rid of unused prescription drugs.

The Oakland County Sheriff's Department kicked-off Operation Medicine Cabinet in Rochester Hills on Wednesday. The program allows anyone to drop off outdated or unused prescriptions, keeping them away from drug abusers and out of the area's water supply.

"We do have a system setup so we can take that medication from you, put it into a drop box. Our Narcotics Unit will then make sure that it is destroyed properly," said Oakland County Sheriff's Department Captain Michael Johnson.

Operation Medicine Cabinet accepts unused prescription drugs every Wednesday at the sheriff's offices in Rochester Hills, Pontiac and Commerce Township.
