## Oxford Twp. man shoots wife in face, police say

An Oxford Township man is facing several felony charges today after Oakland County Sheriff's Office deputies say he shot his wife in the face and ran from authorities.

Jay Kristopher Bartoy, 35, was arraigned by 52-3 District Judge Julie Nicholson in Rochester Hills on charges of attempted murder, fleeing and eluding, drunken driving, carrying a concealed weapon and possessing a firearm in the commission of a felony. If convicted, Bartoy could face up to life in prison.

Deputies were called to a home on the 1100 block of Clearview in Oxford Township at about 11:30 p.m. Friday. When they arrived, they found a 36-year-old woman who had been shot in the face. The woman said she had actually been shot at her home on the 2200 block of Drahner Road but ran from her home with her 14-year-old son to a neighbor's home.

Bartoy, who is in the Oakland County Jail, was seen by deputies driving a GMC Yukon. When deputies tried to stop Bartoy, he drove away, heading north on M-24 through downtown Oxford and into Lapeer County. Authorities from the Metamora Township Police Department, the Lapeer County Sheriff's Office and the Michigan State Police assisted with the chase.

Bartoy, deputies say, rolled his Yukon on M-24 near Pratt Road. He was arrested. Two guns were found in the car.

Bartoy was treated for injuries he sustained in the crash. He'll be back in court Nov. 6 for a pre-exam conference.

According to deputies, Bartoy does not have a criminal record; he and his wife are currently going through a divorce.

The woman is in serious condition. She was shot in the jaw, with the bullet exiting near her right eye. She lost her right eye but is expected to recover.

The couple's son is staying with relatives.
