Oakland County news: Exam set in carjacking case

SOUTHFIELD

The daughter of former Southfield City Councilman and state Rep. Paul Condino faces armed robbery and carjacking charges after police say she and two men conspired to steal a car.

Megan Condino, 18, is free on bond and due back in court Sept. 30 for a preliminary examination. Her attorney, Robyn Frankel, did not return a call.

According to Southfield Police Lt. Nick Loussia, Condino was on a date with a 30-year-old Oak Park man on Sept. 10 when they pulled into a school parking lot off Winchester to talk. Two men approached before her date ran away, leaving Condino and the keys inside the car.

Loussia said detectives concluded Condino was friends with one of the men who was arrested. Two Indiana men -- 19-year-olds Antonio Thomas and Brandon Johnson -- were arrested at an apartment on the 29000 block of Franklin Road. The car was recovered.

COUNTY-WIDE: Deputies still looking for gun in shooting

Oakland County Sheriff's Office deputies are warning residents that a gunman who shot a 5-year-old may have dropped his weapon somewhere in the Oxford area.

The office warned the public not to touch the gun they say the suspect, Keyon Timmons, 30, used to shoot Jordayna Barrett on Sept. 9. Jordayna, who was hit in the jaw, is recovering.

Investigators said Timmons left the Lake Villa Mobile Home Park after the 9:10 p.m. shooting, running from the residence on Shummard Branch north to Laurel Leah, north to Chinkapin Rill to Lakeville Road then west on Lakeville Road.

He is presumed to have then turned south on Bay Pointe and then west on Thornhill Trail. He then headed south on Oxford Lake Drive, then turned west onto Drahner Road, out to M-24. He was arrested in the Kmart parking lot near Clarkston Road in Orion Township. Anyone who finds the gun is asked to call the Sheriff's Office at 248-858-4911.
