Deputy says student assaulted him

A Milford High School student faces charges of assaulting a police officer and resisting arrest after reportedly kicking and scratching the school's liaison officer, an Oakland County deputy, Nov. 6. According to the Oakland County Sheriff's Office, prior to the attack the student had been asked to leave the school because of disorderly conduct. The assistant principal said he then went outside and urinated on the ground. When the liaison officer approached him, the teen reportedly became combative and assaultive. The liaison officer was sent to the Oakland Medical Clinic for treatment. A warrant was issued for the teen for the incident, punishable by up to two years in jail and/or a \$2,000 fine. Arraignment was scheduled for Novi's 52-1 District Court.

Intoxicated woman said she drank just one

A 64-year-old Wixom woman was arrested in Milford last Saturday and cited for drunk driving after registering a blood alcohol level of .12 percent, police said. According to reports, the woman was pulled over on Wixom Road near Uphill Road around 6 p.m. after police noticed she only had her running lights on. She reportedly told police she didn't have the car's other lights on because she couldn't find them. Police suspected she had been drinking, and the woman reportedly admitted consuming one shot of vodka an hour earlier. She also claimed to be coming from church. She was taken to the police station and held until she sobered up. Police then released her on a \$100 bond. By law, a person with a blood alcohol level of .08 percent or higher is considered drunk.

Crack leads to pot charge

A cracked windshield led to the arrest of a man in Milford Nov. 6 on marijuana charges. Police said the man was pulled over after they noticed a crack along the entire width of his windshield. According to reports, the man appeared nervous while talking to police and admitted that he's been charged in the past for delivery and manufacture of marijuana. When police asked if he had any of the drug on him, he reportedly handed over a roach from his cigarette pack and said that was all he had. He was then asked to empty his pockets, and he pulled out a baggie of marijuana. Police said he had 3.2 grams in his possession, and cited him for having marijuana in a motor vehicle. He also got a warning for the cracked windshield.

Stolen diesel

Someone reportedly pumped \$218 in diesel fuel at the Speedway station on S. Milford Road Nov. 6, then left without paying. Police were planning to review a surveillance tape as part of their investigation.

Suspicious circumstances

A Milford woman reported someone smashed a window at her home in the 1800 block of Fenn Street on Nov. 4. Police said she told them she heard glass break shortly after 7 p.m. and when she went to investigate noticed a chair from her deck had been pulled up to the broken window on her house and the screen had been removed. Police were unable to detect any footprints leading up to the window and couldn't find an object that could have caused the damage. The woman was told to contact the

police if she had any more problems.

Amplifiers swiped

Two amplifiers valued at \$350 each were reported stolen from a car parked in a pole barn on W. Moore Road in Milford. The homeowner said the theft occurred some time between 7 a.m. on Nov. 4 and 7 a.m. on Nov. 6. Both the pole barn and car had been left unlocked.
