## MHS student due back in court on Wednesday

A Milford High School student is due back in court Nov. 26 to answer to charges that he assaulted and resisted a police officer during an altercation on school grounds Nov. 6.

Jordan Worrall, 17, was arraigned Nov. 7 in Novi's 52-1 District Court after he reportedly kicked and scratched an Oakland County Sheriff's deputy during an altercation on the grounds of Milford High School Nov. 5. Worrall, free on personal bond, was scheduled for a preexam conference before District Judge Robert Bondy on Nov. 12 but his case was postponed for two weeks.

The deputy, MHS liaison officer Howard Schultz, reportedly was attacked as he attempted to handcuff Worrall after he was spotted urinating on the school wall. Moments earlier, Worrall had been asked to leave the school because of disorderly conduct, including use of profanities and repeatedly talking loudly while on the telephone in the attendance office. Schultz contacted Worrall's mother to come to pick him up or arrange for someone else to do so while Worrall waited outside.

Schultz said Worrall became angry when he wasn't allowed back in the school and was warned that he could be arrested if he didn't adhere to orders. "Then he urinated on the wall, which was witnessed by an assistant principal," Schultz said.

Schultz said at that point he decided to take Worrall into custody, and that's when the assault occurred. Schultz was reportedly kicked in the stomach and received several scratches and cuts on his arms. Other deputies were called to the scene along with OCSO Lt. David Pement, and Worrall was arrested. Schultz was sent to Oakland Medical Center for treatment. None of the injuries was serious.

Worrall, a Milford resident and MHS senior, has a history of disruptive behavior, Schultz said, and has been suspended from school since the incident. He could face a fine of up to \$2,000 and two years in jail.
