Man investigated for alleged indecent exposure

Oakland County Sheriff's Department deputies are investigating a neighborhood dispute in Highland Township involving alleged acts of indecent exposure and vandalism.

On Thursday, Sept. 3, at 11:18 p.m., Oakland County Sheriff's deputies were called to a home on Norman Drive in Highland Township to investigate a complaint of indecent exposure.

A man called dispatchers to report that his neighbor was walking around his front porch fully naked.

According to a Sheriff's Department report, the man told police he and his nephew were sitting on his home's front porch when they saw the neighbor walking around completely nude.

When police confronted the neighbor, he denied being naked on his porch.

Later, at approximately 1:40 a.m. on Friday, Sept. 4, the same man called police again — this time to report that the same neighbor had flattened the tires on four vehicles parked in his driveway.

When police arrived, the man said he had heard a noise outside and went to check it out. When he looked outside, he saw his neighbor walking away from the front of the home where the cars were parked.

Police noted that each of the four vehicles in the driveway had flattened tires.

When police questioned the neighbor, he again denied the allegations and said he had not left his home all night.

The incident remains under investigation.
