Sheriff: 4 Teens Got High, Crashed Car

2 Teens Injured After Car Crashes Into Garage

ROCHESTER HILLS, Mich. -- Four Rochester Hills teens could be facing charges after allegedly getting high off a computer cleaning product and crashing a car into a garage, Oakland County Sheriff Michael Bouchard said Monday.

Bouchard said the incident happened at about 1 p.m. on Sunday, in the 2000 block of Lassiter Drive in Rochester Hills.

Deputies were called after witnesses reported seeing a white Pontiac Grand Prix accelerate toward a home, hit a retaining wall and go airborne into a garage, Bouchard said.

Bouchard said the incident caused "extensive damage to the garage area of the home."

The teens attempted to flee the scene but were apprehended by deputies shortly after.

Bouchard said the teens, ages 14 to 17, admitted to huffing (inhaling) "Dust Destroyer," a compressed can of air used to clean computer keyboards, and drinking.

The 16-year-old driver passed out while driving and the other teens were unable to maneuver the car before it struck the wall and crashed into the garage, Bouchard said.

The 16-year-old driver remains in stable condition after being transported to a Pontiac hospital after the incident.

A 17-year-old passenger was also treated and released from Crittenton Hospital.

Deputies said they recovered four cans of the cleaning product, a green pipe and a 40-ounce bottle of Milwaukee beer from the car.

Bouchard said the teens were released to their parents and charges are pending after a complete investigation is finished.

Three of the teens are students on Rochester Adams High school and the other is a student at Stoney Creek High School.
