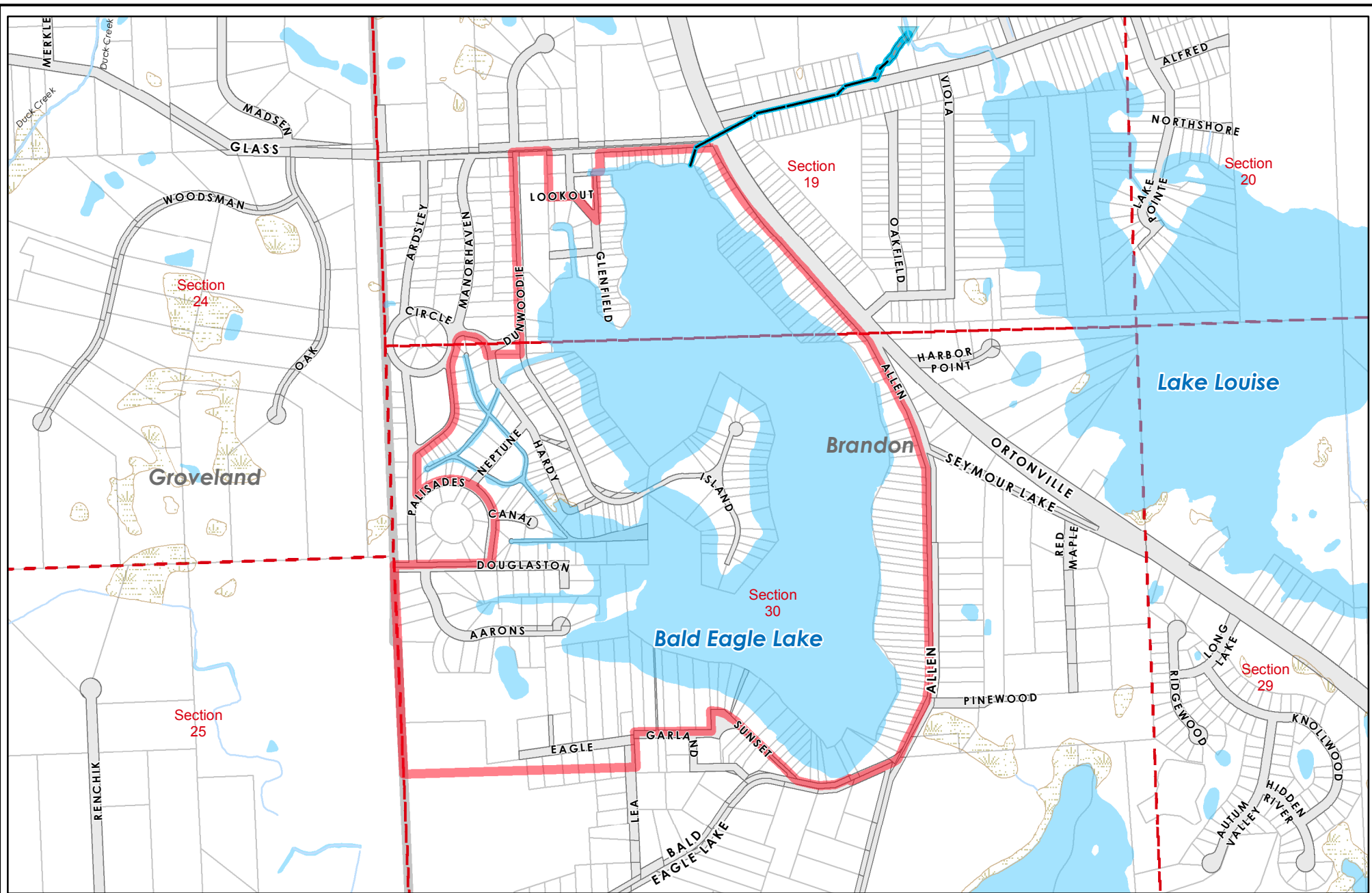


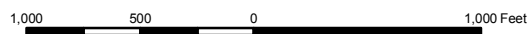
The Bald Eagle Lake Drain was established in 1929. The drain has its beginning at the north end of Bald Eagle Lake, where it serves as an overflow and outlet for the lake. From Bald Eagle Lake it flows north to Glass Road, thence easterly along Glass Road to its outlet into a branch of the Flint River. The drain is enclosed. Portions of the drain east of Ortonville Road were replaced by the state Highway Department in 1973 when Ortonville Road was improved. The drain is 1,593 feet in length.
