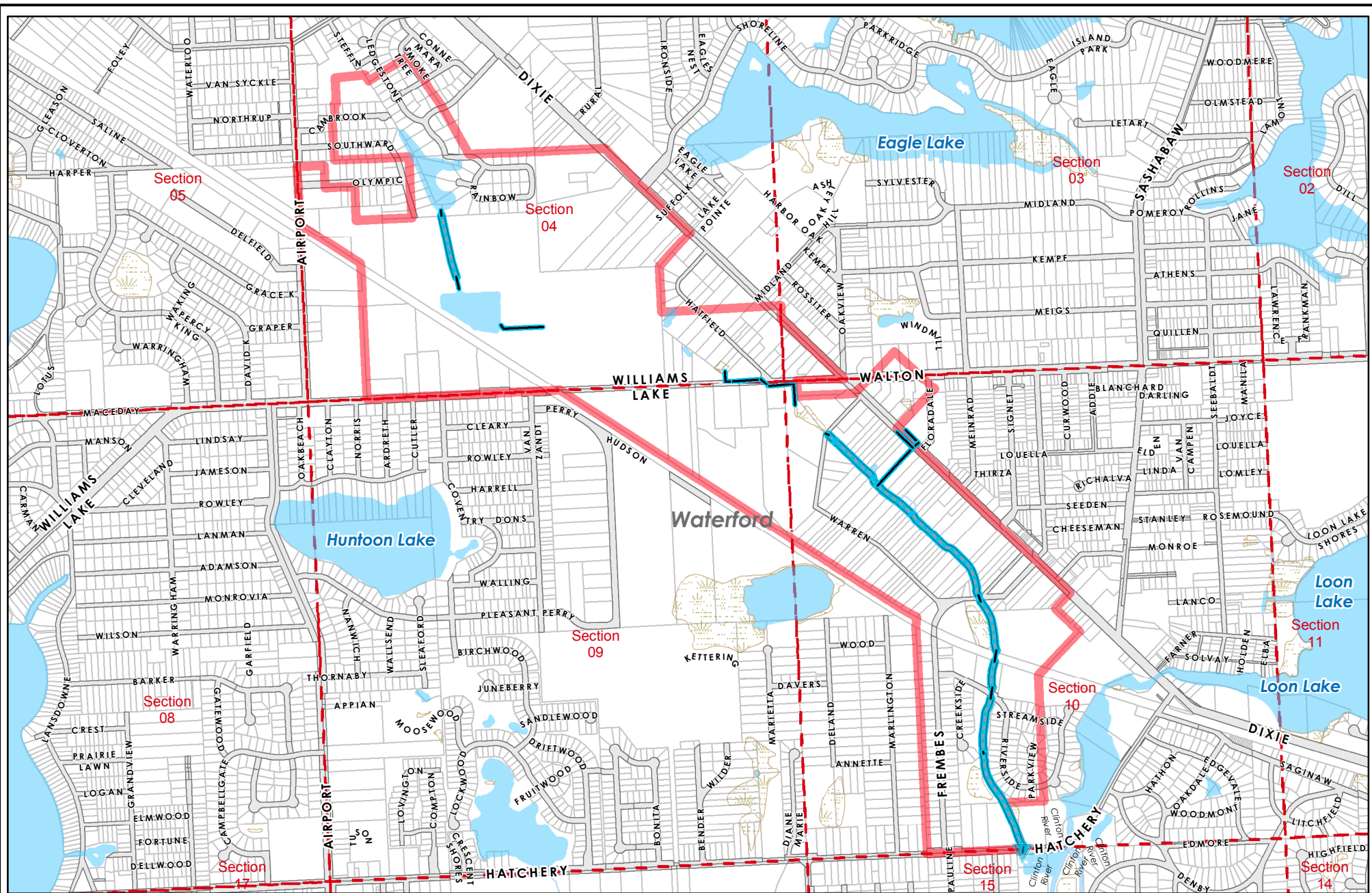


Drayton Plains County Drain

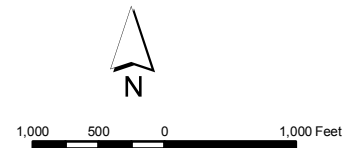
The Drayton Plains Drain was established in 1921 in accordance with Michigan Drain Law in effect at that time. The drain was established by constructing a combination of open ditch and enclosed pipe for just over 2 miles for the public health, convenience and welfare of the people. The cost of the work was \$14,187.66. The Drayton Plains Drain collects runoff from 524 acres and flows southeasterly into the Clinton River. A map indicating the drainage district and the location of the drain is available below.
