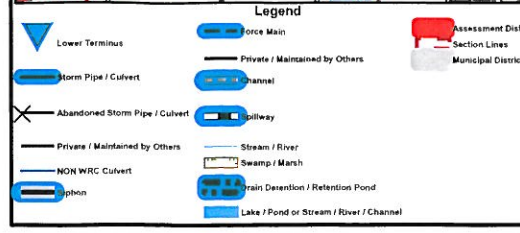
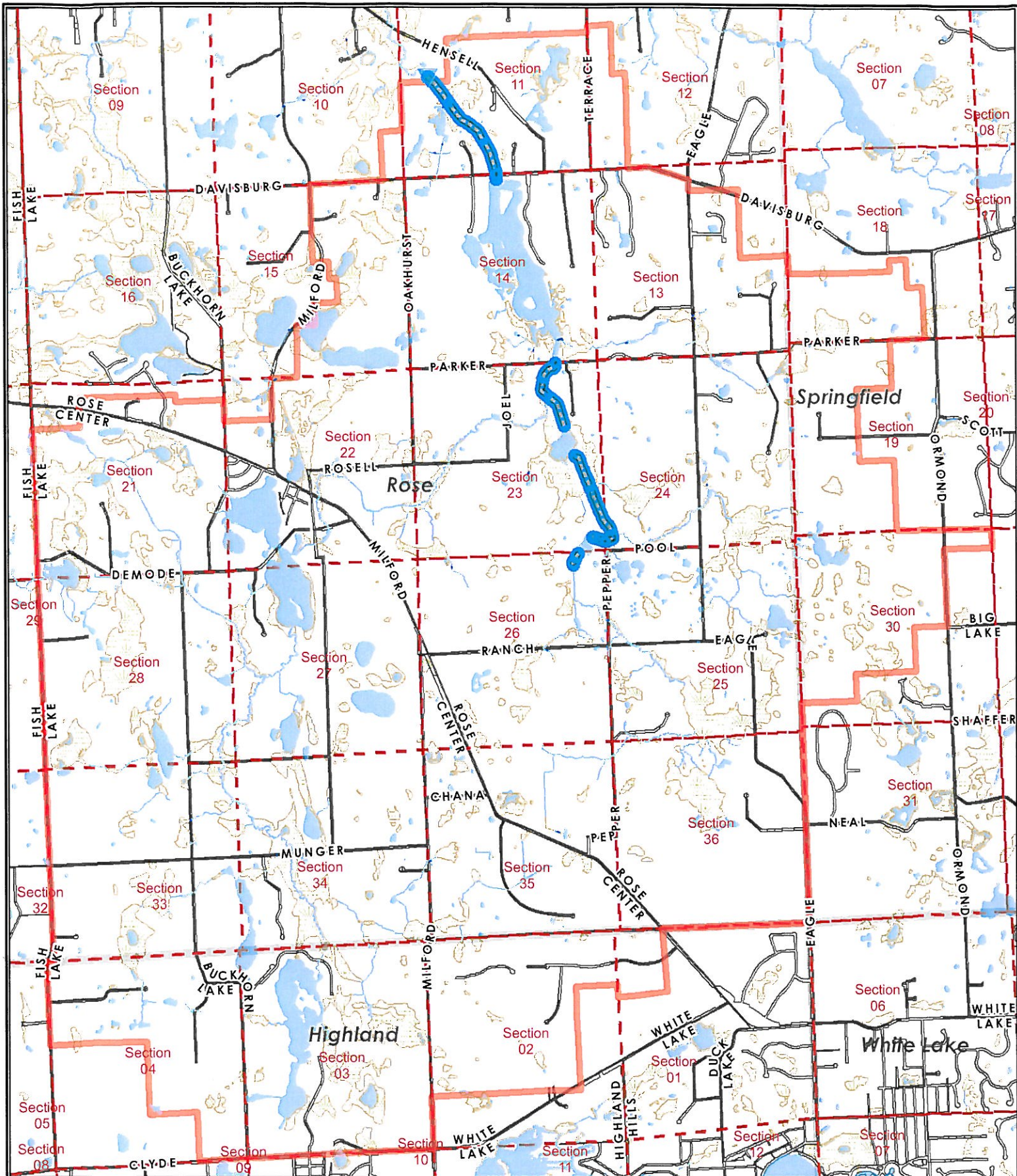


The Garner Drain was established in 1917 in accordance with Michigan Drain law in effect at that time. The Drain was established by cleaning out and widening approximately three miles of an existing watercourse known at that time as the Buckhorn River. The cost of this work was \$10,800. The Garner Drain collects runoff from over 12,000 acres and connects several lakes and tributaries over its length as indicated on the enclosed drawing. A map indicating the drainage district and the location of the drain is below.
