# CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSITION A CHAPTER III, SECTION 4 AND CHAPTER IV, SECTION 7

The proposed amendment amends Chapter III, Section 4, and Chapter IV, Section 7, to acknowledge that city commissioners are elected to 2 year terms at the odd-year November election commencing with 3 commissioners being elected at this 2013 election and all 5 commissioners being elected in November 2015. Shift from annual May elections to the November odd-year general election was made last fall by the statutorily-authorized Resolution 22-2012 of the Commission. The amendment also provides that a commissioner's term of office commences on the first Tuesday after the commissioner's election.

Shall this amendment be adopted?

# CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSITION B CHAPTER III, SECTION 5

Chapter III, Section 5 [Organizational meetings; election of mayor and mayor pro tem] provides for an organizational meeting of the city commission. At this meeting the commissioners elect from among themselves a mayor and mayor pro tem on the first Monday after each city election. It is proposed that the day for this organizational meeting be changed, from the first Monday after each city election, to a regularly scheduled meeting in November of each year.

Shall this amendment be adopted?

# CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSITION C CHAPTER IV, SECTION 4

Chapter IV, Section 4 [Conflicts of Interest] provides that no member of the city commission shall vote for any contract or expenditure of any city money if he or she is financially interested in the proceeds of the contract or expenditure. It is proposed that a second sentence be added to this section to authorize the commission to implement this section by adopting a resolution or ordinance.

# CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSITION D CHAPTER VII, SECTION 9

The proposed amendment to Chapter VII, Section 9, [Annual Budget] changes the deadline date for the commission to prepare an annual budget, from the 10<sup>th</sup> day in May, to the second Tuesday in May.

Shall this amendment be adopted?

#### **CITY OF CLAWSON**

#### RUBBISH MILLAGE PROPOSAL

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the City of Clawson be increased by 0.8482 mills (\$0.85 per thousand dollars of taxable value) in perpetuity beginning in 2014, as new additional millage in excess of the limitation imposed by Michigan Compiled Laws section 211.34d, to restore previously authorized millage as reduced by operation of the Headlee amendment, to provide funds for garbage and rubbish collection and disposal services? #### **CITY OF KEEGO HARBOR**

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSAL NO. 1**

This amendment would repeal Sections 8.1 through 8.10 of Article 8, of the City of Keego Harbor City Charter, which provide for the establishment of a Justice Court and eliminate any mention of a Justice of the Peace or Justice Court in Section 3.2, 3.3, 3.11 and 7.6(g). This amendment removes any references in the City Charter to the office of Constable in the City of Keego Harbor City Charter.

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSAL NO. 3**

This Amendment to the Keego Harbor City Charter deletes Article 9 (Supervisors) referring to the appointment of supervisors. The county is now divided into commissioner districts, each of which elects a member of the County Board of Commissioners.

# GENERAL OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSAL (RESTORATION OF "HEADLEE" REDUCTION)

This proposal requests an increase in the millage rate for general municipal purposes. The "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963 has caused a reduction in the City of Lake Angelus' millage rate. The increase will allow the City to levy an additional 2 mills, an amount permitted under its Charter.

Shall a "Headlee Override" be adopted so that the current limitation on the amount of City taxes that may be levied against all taxable property in the City of Lake Angelus, Oakland County, Michigan be increased up to 2 mills from 10.1588 to 12.1588 mills (\$12.1588 per \$1,000 dollars of taxable value on all real and personal property)? If approved and levied in its entirety this additional millage could raise an estimated \$130,000 for the City of Lake Angelus.

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT 1**

This Charter amendment would delete the requirement that the City Assessor be a resident of the City. The current residency requirement is not enforceable under current state law.

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT 2**

This Charter amendment would provide that the Clerk and the Treasurer of the City need not be residents of the City when appointed or during their terms of office.

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSAL 4**

#### Question

Shall the Novi Charter be amended to reorganize and restate the existing Section 4.6, which describes the City's administrative plan; to combine the provisions of Section 4.13, which establishes the Finance, Public Safety, and Public Service departments and authorizes the Council to create other departments, with the reorganized and restated Section 4.6 and delete Section 4.13 entirely; to provide in Section 4.6 for the establishment of administrative departments and offices by both Council and the City Manager; and to amend the current reference to Section 4.13 contained in Section 4.7 to a reference to Section 4.6?

At the September 13, 2005 Primary Election, City of Rochester Hills voters approved a Proposal to provide funding to permanently preserve green spaces and natural features within the City "by funding the purchase of land and interests in land, and enabling the City to seek matching grant funds by levying a new millage of up to 0.3 mills." It is proposed to revise the permissible use of tax revenues derived from this millage to authorize it to be used to fund the protection, care and maintenance of, and to improve pedestrian accessibility to and within, green spaces and natural features owned, acquired or controlled by the City, in addition to funding the purchase of land and interests in land.

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT "PROPOSAL 1"**

Currently, the City Charter at Chapter Three, Section 3, restricts eligibility for Mayor or Commissioner to persons who first has attained the age of 25 at the time of election.

The proposed amendment, if adopted, would allow anyone to serve as Mayor or Commissioner who has attained the age of 21 at the time of election and who is otherwise eligible.

Shall the proposal be adopted?

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT "PROPOSAL 2"**

Currently, the City Charter at Chapter Three, Section 3, restricts eligibility for Mayor or Commissioner to persons who are freeholders of the city (real estate property owners).

Due to various court rulings holding that freeholder eligibility requirements for elective office violates the Equal Protection Clause of the Michigan and Federal constitutions this freeholder eligibility clause is currently unenforceable.

The proposed amendment, if adopted, would eliminate this requirement in the City Charter at Chapter Three, Section 3, for Mayor and Commissioner. Shall the proposal be adopted?

#### **CHARTER AMENDMENT "PROPOSAL 3"**

#### **NOVI COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT**

#### I. OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to maintain the number of mills required to be levied on all property to enable the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance and renews operating millage that will expire with the 2013 tax levy.

Shall the total limitation on the amount of taxes for operating purposes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Novi Community School District, Oakland County, Michigan, be renewed by 18.00 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) and against all principal residences, qualified agricultural property, qualified forest property, industrial personal property and commercial personal property by 5.49 mills (\$5.49 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), both millages to be for a period of 10 years, 2014 to 2023, inclusive; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect from combined local property taxes authorized herein if the millage is approved and levied in 2014 is approximately \$17,878,374?

#### II. MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO OPERATE A SYSTEM OF PUBLIC RECREATION AND PLAYGROUNDS.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 0.98 mill (\$0.98 on each \$1,000.00 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Novi Community School District, Oakland County, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 10 years, 2014 to 2023, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds to continue to operate a system of public recreation and playgrounds; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect for such recreation program if the millage is approved and levied in 2014 is approximately \$1,950,374 (this is a renewal of millage which will expire with the 2013 tax levy)?

# COUNTIES OF MACOMB AND OAKLAND STATE OF MICHIGAN

#### SCHOOL BUS BOND PROPOSITION

Shall the Romeo Community Schools, Counties of Macomb and Oakland, State of Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Five Million One Hundred Thousand (\$5,100,000) Dollars and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of paying for the cost of purchasing school buses?

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The estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year is 0.07 mills (\$0.07 per \$1,000 of taxable value). The maximum number of years the proposed bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is not more than ten (10) years; and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire the proposed bonds is 0.47 mills annually (\$0.47 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

If approved by the voters, the bonds will be guaranteed by the State under the School Bond Qualification and Loan Program (the "Program"). The School District currently has \$33,640,000 of qualified bonds outstanding and \$0 of qualified loans outstanding under the Program. The School District does not expect to borrow from the Program to pay debt service on these bonds. The estimated computed millage rate required to be levied to pay the proposed bonds may change in the future based on changes in certain circumstances.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for teacher, administrator or employee salaries, repair or maintenance costs or other operating expenses.)

#### SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF ROYAL OAK

#### **OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL**

This proposal, if approved by the electors, will allow the School District of the City of Royal Oak to continue to levy the number of operating mills required for the School District to receive revenues at the full per pupil foundation allowance permitted by the State of Michigan.

Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, situated within the School District of the City of Royal Oak, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, be increased as provided in the Michigan Constitution, in the amount of 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), and against all principal residences and other property not exempted by law, by 3.4 mills (\$3.40 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), both millages to be for a period of seven (7) years, from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2021, inclusive with the above 18 mills and the above 3.40 mills (which is a reduction from the 3.5030 mills previously authorized by the electors) being a renewal of millage which would otherwise expire on December 31, 2013? These operating millages if approved and levied, would provide estimated revenues to the School District of Eighteen Million Eight Hundred Thousand (\$18,800,000) Dollars during the 2014 calendar year, to be used for general operating purposes.

#### SOUTH LYON COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

#### OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance and renews millage that will expire with the 2014 tax levy.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 19.9720 mills (\$19.9720 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in South Lyon Community Schools, Oakland, Washtenaw and Livingston Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 10 years, 2015 to 2024, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2015 is approximately \$7,617,568 (this is a renewal of millage which will expire with the 2014 tax levy)?

#### SOUTHFIELD PUBLIC SCHOOLS

#### **RENEWAL OF OPERATING MILLAGE**

This proposal would renew expiring authority of the Southfield Public Schools to levy mills for general operating purposes. Under this proposal, due to current enrollment projections and statutory exemptions, principal residences, qualified agricultural property, industrial personal property and other property to the extent not otherwise exempt for this purpose under State law would be partially exempt from the 18 mill levy, and the School District would continue to be eligible to receive full per pupil revenue permitted by law.

As a renewal of authority which expires with the 2014 levy, shall the limitation on the taxes which may be levied upon taxable property in the Southfield Public Schools, Oakland County, Michigan, be increased by 18.00 mills (\$18.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for six years, the years 2015 to 2020, inclusive, to provide funds for operating expenses of the District? Of the 18.00 mills, no more than 17.6345 mills (\$17.6345 per \$1,000 of taxable value) may be levied on principal residences, qualified agricultural property and industrial personal property. This authorization would allow the District to raise through levy an estimated \$41 million in operating revenue in 2015.

- -Constructing additions to school buildings; and
- -Preparing, developing and improving sites at school buildings and other facilities and the purchase of school buses?

The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is not more than fifteen (15) years; the estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year is 1.84 mills (which is equal to \$1.84 per \$1,000 of taxable value); and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire the bonds over fifteen (15) years is 2.93 mills annually (\$2.93 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

If approved by the voters, the bonds will be guaranteed by the State under the School Bond Qualification and Loan Program (the "Program"). The School District currently has \$93,605,000 of qualified bonds outstanding and \$0 of qualified loans outstanding under the Program. The School District does not expect to borrow from the Program to pay debt service on these bonds. The estimated computed millage rate required to be levied to pay the proposed bonds may change in the future based on changes in certain circumstances.

-Constructing additions to school building entrances to enhance security; and
-Preparing, developing and improving sites at school buildings and other facilities and the purchase of school buses?

The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is not more than thirty (30) years; the estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year is 0.78 mills (which is equal to \$0.78 per \$1,000 of taxable value); and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire the bonds over thirty (30) years is 0.99 mills annually (\$0.99 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

If approved by the voters, the bonds will be guaranteed by the State under the School Bond Qualification and Loan Program (the "Program"). The School District currently has \$115,325,000 of qualified bonds outstanding and \$0 of qualified loans outstanding under the Program. The School District does not expect to borrow from the Program to pay debt service on these bonds. The estimated computed millage rate required to be levied to pay the proposed bonds may change in the future based on changes in certain circumstances.

#### **MOTT COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

#### **BOND PROPOSITION**

Shall Charles Stewart Mott Community College, Genesee County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000) and issue its bonds therefor in one or more series for the purpose of making permanent improvements to, renovating, remodeling, improving, equipping and reequipping College buildings and sites and other buildings to be used by the College for instructional purposes; acquiring buildings and sites for buildings; and constructing buildings and additions to buildings?

The maximum number of years each series of bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is 20 years; the estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year that the levy is authorized is 0.08 mills (which is equal to 08 cents per \$1,000.00 of taxable value of real and tangible personal property in the College District); and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire the bonds is 0.25 mills (which is equal to 25 cents per \$1,000.00 of taxable value of real and tangible personal property in the College District).
