Welcome and Introductions

- Meeting commenced at 2 PM and introductions were made.

Homeless Summit Presentation Update

- Elizabeth Kelly & Debra Hendren presented at the Homeless Summit on the ID Task Force.
- The Homeless Summit included people from all over Michigan asking how to join the SoS pilot program.
- Elizabeth & Deb stated the need for other communities to be able to have access to the exceptions program.
- Answers to questions asked at the Summit include:
 - You cannot exchange a revoked expired DL for a free non-compliant card.
 - Nicole Odom asked about the Driver Responsibility fee. It was stated that the legislation is working to get the driver responsibility fee repealed, and that in 2019 it will go away, and has already started to phase out.

Compliant ID's

- By 2020, you will need a compliant ID to get into certain buildings such as federal buildings, airports, etc.
- Every new person to Michigan will get a compliant card.
- If a person gets a non-compliant card today, they can get their birth certificate and bring that back in to get a compliant card.
- Some people may want to renew a non-starred card if they have a passport.

General Discussion on SoS Pilot

- James Fackler stated that as of right now they do not want to expand the pilot program to other counties because they don't want to put this out there as a secondary process or alternative to the real compliant ID. If an agency comes to SoS, they are willing to try and help them.

County Reports

- Whitney from the Detroit Health Department who is also a part of the Municipal ID Task Force stated they are revisiting the list of circumstances for folks who cannot produce any type of information for an ID. Her contact info is smithw@detroit.mi.gov or 313-574-6495

Statewide Advocacy Efforts for ID

- Jason from MCAH stated that they are not using the dropbox anymore and are moving all resources to a website. He will share the link to the website with the group and is open to recommendations for new documents.
- The addition of the Veteran's to the Free ID for Me has passed the Senate, and is now on to the house for review.
- MCAH is drafting a letter to SoS that so far includes 30 organizations and 100 people, who are interested in being a part of the SoS pilot program.
