The Oakland County Senior Advisory Council is a non-funded council established by the late L. Brooks Patterson, consisting of 25 members - one from each Commissioner's district and four members-at-large. Council members are guided by their bylaws. The Council informs the County Executive of the needs and services required by the older adults in Oakland County and points out resource gaps in their districts.
