MDHHS provides help in locating and selecting licensed community care facilities, such as Adult Foster Care Homes and Nursing Homes, for people who can no longer live independently. Contact your local DHS office for information and eligibility requirements of each of these services.

Adult Protective Services:

The goal of the Adult Protective Services Program is to assist those persons 18 years or older who have been abused, neglected, or exploited and who are vulnerable and unable to take the necessary steps to correct their situation. To report adult abuse or neglect in Michigan, call **855-444-3911**, anytime. (This number also takes calls for Children's Protective Services referrals.)

Home Help Services (HHS):

Non-specialized personal care services are available to those customers who meet eligibility requirements. These programs assist functionally limited individuals to remain in their independent settings for as long as possible.
