Financials

- The Court collected \$17,153,947 in 2025.
- Oakland County is the funding unit for the Court and receives the largest distribution.
- The Court also collects and distributes bond and restitution (not pictured).
- The Court does not retain any of the funds it collects.
- The Court has no mechanism to generate “revenue” and only collects and distributes what is authorized by law.
