The purpose of this memorandum is to communicate a recommendation to the Board of the George W. Kuhn Drainage District (GWK) detailing the proposed monthly charges to our customers based on approved Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) monthly charges for its fiscal 2026-27 rate year.

The attached monthly charges were presented to the GWK customers on April 20, 2026. Customer representatives were advised that we would continue to follow the rate share calculation based on a 5-year average of water volume to determine each customers' monthly sewage charge. These percentages are reviewed annually during the rate-setting process. The stormwater charge continues to be based on the apportionment percentages previously adopted by the Board. The revised monthly charges for services will be billed effective July 2026.

Increases in operating, major maintenance, and capital improvement expenses result in an overall 6.1% increase from the previous year for combined sewage and stormwater charges. Please refer to the attached Schedule of Rates and Charges for a list of charges for each customer. Detailed worksheets, including a Financial Summary, Monthly Charge Schedule, and Share and Monthly Charge Comparison, are also attached.

Recommended Action: Approve the rates and charges for the rate year beginning July 1, 2026, as presented.

Approved by this Board on March 26, 2024, the green stormwater infrastructure features of the George W. Kuhn Retention Treatment Basin Facility Parking Lot Improvements Project - Phase 1 are now complete. Phase 1 of the project included installation of a bioretention area, shade trees, and conversion of three acres of turf grass into native prairie grow zones. This phase was part of the overall project to repair, expand, and redesign the existing parking lot which was completed in 2025.

The planted bioretention area serving the parking lot requires maintenance such as regular weeding, native plant condition assessment and replacement, and maintaining mulch and inlet stone levels. This maintenance is particularly important during the critical establishment period.

The attached Clinton River Watershed Council (CWRC) proposal offers two years of seasonal maintenance of the bioretention area, including spring cleaning and maintenance of the planted material, planting bed and inlets; monthly summer maintenance; and fall cleaning and maintenance. The estimated annual cost of this maintenance is \$4,600 in 2026 and \$5,000 in 2027 for an estimated total of \$9,600. However, as a pilot maintenance program based on services provided on a time and materials basis, staff recommends authorizing a not-to-exceed amount of \$12,000 based on the estimates provided in the proposal and allowing for moderate increases in material costs and additional maintenance, as needed, over the two-year contract period.

The CRWC has an existing contract with the District and currently performs assessments on rain gardens installed as part of the RainSmart Rebate program. After review of the current proposal, staff recommends amending the existing contract as proposed for an additional two years. This recommendation is based on the Council's understanding of the project, coupled with similar project experience and qualified staff.

Requested Action: Authorize the Chairperson to execute the contract amendment with the Clinton River Watershed Council through 2027 for annual maintenance of the bioretention area serving the GWK parking lot for an amount not to exceed a total of \$12,000.



The purpose of this memorandum is to communicate a recommendation to the Board of the Evergreen-Farmington Sanitary Drain Drainage District (EFSD) detailing the proposed monthly charges to our customers based on approved Great Lakes Water Authority monthly charges for its fiscal 2026-27 rate year.

The attached exhibits highlighting the proposed budget, sewer charges, cost allocation, and capital improvement plan, were presented to the EFSD customers on April 21, 2026.

The proposed budget and sewer charges are attached in Exhibit A. Because of increases in operating expenses, the total annual charge to the customers will increase 3.1% to \$57,861,500.

The proposed cost allocation to each customer for operation and maintenance charges is included in Exhibit B. The methodology will remain the same as previous years, based on a rolling 5-year flow average.

Recommended Action: Approve the proposed operating budget and sewer charges (Exhibit A) and cost allocation (Exhibit B) for the rate year beginning July 1, 2026, as presented.



DATE: April 28, 2026

This memo accompanies the attached proposals from Hubbel, Roth & Clark, Inc. (HRC) and D'Angelo Brothers, Inc. to rehabilitate the existing roller gate at the Henry Graham Drain outfall. The existing gate was installed in 1972 and was originally used to regulate the levels in the Henry Graham Drain at the discharge point into the Red Run Drain. At some point the gate operator was damaged or became inoperable and the gate was raised out of the flow path and left in place. As part of a pilot study with the Army Corps of Engineers; the gate was removed to allow for a camera system to be put into the gate channel to detect oil sheens on the water surface. The Red Run drain board has requested that Henry Graham roller gate be reinstalled.

The design services for HRC are estimated to cost \$141,500. HRC will evaluate the existing gate and develop plans to rehabilitate the existing gate along with a new stem and actuator modifications. In addition, the controls for the gate will be updated. D'Angelo Brothers will help move the gate around during the cleaning and inspection process. Their estimated cost is \$5,236. Additional funds for the construction phase will be recommended after the gate has been evaluated and design drawings developed.

Requested Action: Approve the cost for the design phase of the project for a not-to-exceed amount of \$146,736.

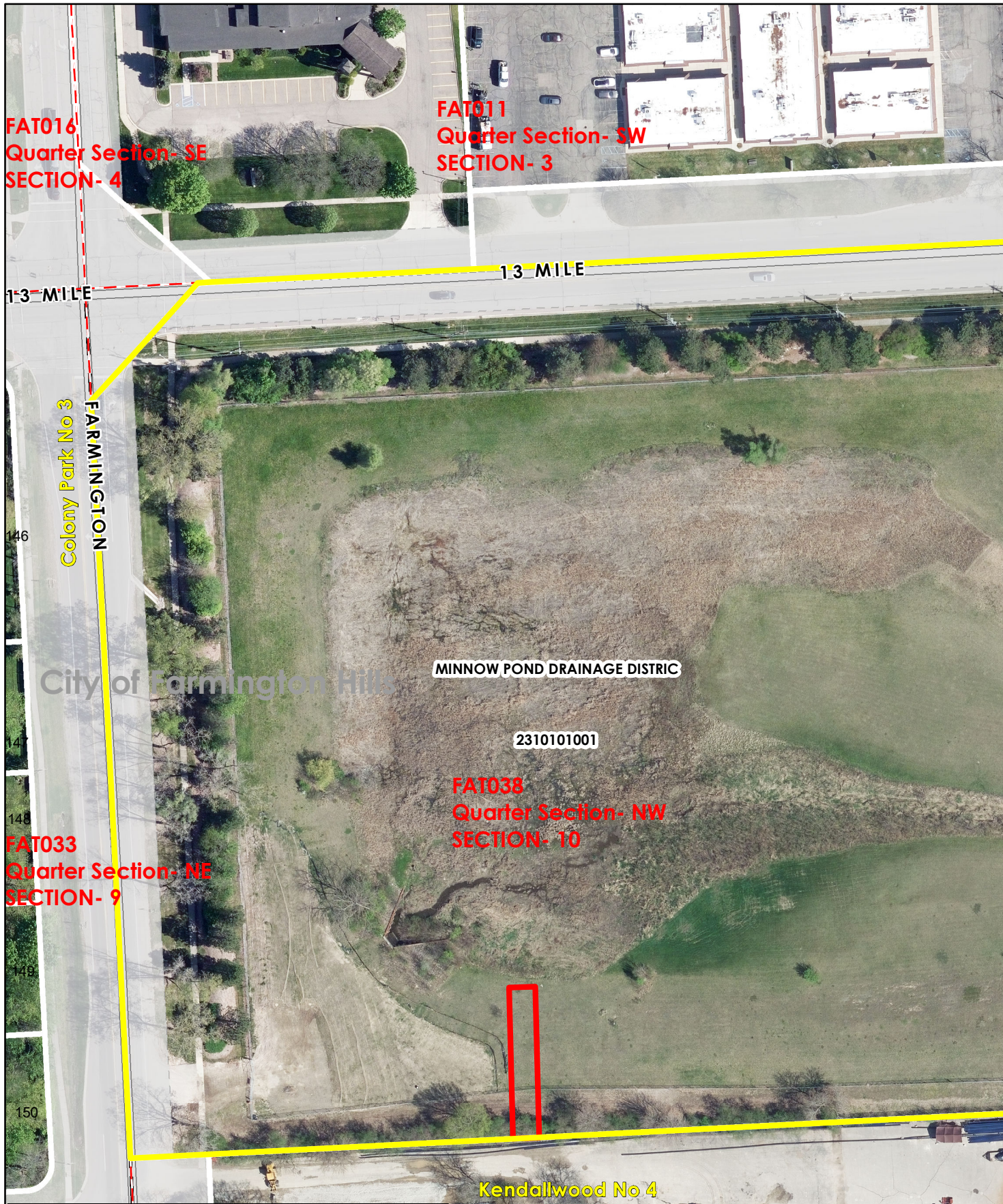

Bids for the Luz Relief Drains Extension project were received on March 27, 2026 and are summarized in the attached bid tabulation prepared by the consulting engineer for the project, Hubbell, Roth & Clark, Inc. (HRC). The low bid of \$465,274.36 was submitted by D'Angelo Brothers, Inc. of Farmington Hills, Michigan.

An April 7, 2026, pre-award meeting with D'Angelo Brothers was conducted by staff accompanied by HRC and Bloomfield Township representatives. Having carefully reviewed the bid documents and assessed D'Angelo Brothers' experience and qualifications, it is recommended that the contract be awarded to D'Angelo Brothers, Inc. (See attached letter.) Based on HRC's recommendation and the district's lengthy experience working with D'Angelo Brothers, I support the recommendation and recommend the Board award the construction contract to D'Angelo Brothers, Inc. in the amount of \$465,274.36.
