### Change in Hours at County Donation Drop Off

Pontiac, Michigan – While personal protective equipment for healthcare workers and first responders remains in short supply, Oakland County has changed the hours for its donation drop off point to 9 a.m. to noon, Monday through Friday at the [Oakland County Farmers Market](#), 2350 Pontiac Lake Road in Waterford beginning immediately.

“The response from the community has been amazing. People, businesses and organizations answered the call when it was needed most,” said Oakland County Executive David Coulter. “We feel like a large majority of PPE and other items that were available have already been put into the hands of those who needed them, so our drop off volume has reduced significantly.”

Oakland County continues to accept donations of masks (all types), face shields, surgical gowns, surgical gloves, no-touch thermometers, and respirators.
