

The Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner (WRC) is proposing to receive “domestic septage” waste for treatment and disposal at the Clinton River Water Resource Recovery Facility (CRWRRF) Septage Unloading Site located at 155 N. Opdyke Road, Pontiac, Michigan 48342, and plans to request approval of its CRWRRF Septage Unloading Site Operating Plan by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE). A copy of the CRWRRF Septage Unloading Site Operating Plan is available for review at the CRWRRF during normal business hours, as follows: Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m., subject to the WRC’s normal holiday schedule. A copy of this notice and the Operating Plan have also been posted on the WRC’s website (<http://Oakgov.com/WRCSeptage>); and have also been sent by first-class mail to the county health departments of each county located in whole or in part within the 25-mile service area of the CRWRRF Septage Unloading Site and to the City Council of the City of Pontiac, Michigan.
